The college together with the Embassy of Japan and JICA held the JICA Chair and Japan week (22nd-25th March 2022) as part of the activities to celebrate the 100 years of Makerere University's service to humanity. The four days event held under the theme, "Learning from Japan's unique Experience of Development", was officially opened by the Ambassador of Japan to Uganda H.E Fukuzawa Hidemoto at the Auditorium in the Central Teaching Facility 2 at Makerere university.

The weeklong celebration to symbolize the friendship between Uganda and Japan was graced by the Senior Representative Japan Internal Cooperation Agency, Uganda Mr. Fukuhara Ichiro, Makerere

university Vice Chancellor Prof. Barnabas Nawangwe the Principal CHUSS Associate Prof. Josephine Ahikire, the Dean School of Liberal and Performing Arts and Film and the Head Department of History, Archeology and Heritage Studies Dr. Charlotte Karungi Mafumbo.

ZADOK ADOLU-OTOJOKA HONORED FOR THE MAK@100 CELEBRATIONS

Zadok Adolu-Otojoka Biography Recital: Lessons from Half a Century of Music Teaching”.

CHUSS through the Department of Performing Arts and Film spearhead by Milton Wabyona honored Zadok Adolu -Otojoka as part of the activities to Mark the Mak @100 celebrations. The college came up with an event, dubbed “ *Zadok Adolu-Otojoka Biography Recital: Lessons from Half a Century of Music Teaching*”.

This recital was held on March 31, 2022, at Makerere University, where Adolu-Otojoka was honored by the university faculty, students and alumni for his invaluable and monumental contribution to academia.

The honor was premised on the fact that the value of history in determining future outcomes is strongly implied in the notion that educators can only better prepare for the future with adequate knowledge of the past.

The Zadok Adolu-Otojoka Biography Recital is a musical arts presentation aimed at exploring through the 52-years of professional music teaching by Zadok Adolu-Otojoka, with a view to learning and understanding the trends, as well as predicting the future of the music education discipline in Uganda

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At Makerere, he was particularly famous for his charismatic conducting of the university anthem and the mesmerizing leadership of the academic procession during graduation ceremonies.

Zadok Adolu-Otojoka is one of the highly celebrated icons of music education and professional music performance in Uganda and East Africa. Educated in Uganda and in the United States, Adolu-Otojoka has taught music at all levels of the formal education pyramid in East Africa, with the most distinguished acclaim.

At the peak of his teaching career in Uganda, he served as Head of Department of Music, Dance and Drama (now Performing Arts and Film) at Makerere University in the mid- to late-1990s. At Makerere, he was particularly famous for his charismatic conducting of the university anthem and the mesmerizing leadership of the academic procession during graduation ceremonies.

Adolu-Otojoka is revered for his extra-ordinary talent in both

Western and African musical art forms and passion for the music profession, in which he excelled and mentored generations.

This biography recital is based on the article: “Zadok Adolu-Otojoka and Music Education in Uganda: An Oral History” by Milton Wabyona, published on January 27, 2022, in an American *Journal of Historical Research in Music Education*. The purpose of this recital was to highlight some of the senior educator’s experiences, approaches and recommendations presented in his oral history.

The recital repertoire primarily focus on some of Adolu-Otojoka’s favorite works, particularly, those highlighted in his oral history as well as recitations of select sections of his life story.

The performance forces will include some of Adolu-Otojoka’s former students, acquaintances, professional musicians and music faculty alongside current music students from Makerere University.

The recital provided valuable inspiration for the young music education discipline in Uganda and insights regarding multicultural music education perspectives.

MAK SIGNS COLLABORATION AGREEMENT WITH YUNUS EMRE INSTITUTE, TURKEY



Representing the Vice Chancellor, Associate Prof. Umar Kakumba, the Deputy Vice Chancellor (Academic Affairs) assured the Turkish delegation that Makerere University will provide land where to construct the institute.



Makerere University on Friday, 25th February, 2022 signed a memorandum of understanding with Yunus Emre Institute of Turkey aimed at enhancing international communication and building strong relations with Turkey.

The MOU was signed on behalf of Makerere and Yunus Emre Institute by Associate Prof. Umar Kakumba, Deputy Vice Chancellor (Academic Affairs) and Dr. Abdullah Kutalmis Yalcin, Vice President Yunus Emre Institute respectively.

By signing this protocol, Turkish language courses will start at Makerere University and will be

taught by Lecturers appointed from Turkey. The Lecturer will equally guide Ugandan students on study programmes/courses in Turkey, how to apply for scholarships and internship in the country.

Article 3 of the memorandum of understanding entails areas of co-operation by both parties among which include, developing joint research, organizing joint academic, scientific and cultural events, reviewing academic curricula/programmes. Other areas of cooperation include; providing Makerere University with

the usage of the cultural center of the Institute spread across 63 nations in the world, developing joint industrial approaches and entrepreneurship programmes and developing joint courses, training and summers schools.

He thanked the Yunus Emre Foundation and Turkish government for their commitment to the partnership with Makerere University and Uganda in general.

The conference was organized by the School of Women and Gender Studies as part of the celebrations to commemorate a century of excellent service to humanity by Makerere University. The conference was organized as a platform for Gender Scholars world over to network, share experiences and establish lasting collaborations that will shape Gender Studies in Africa.

Participants had reflections on teaching of gender studies and how to improve it, gender focused research, how gender has been applied in the field of practice as well as impact and benefits of gender studies in Africa.



The conference brought together more than 480 papers from African scholars with an endorsement of more than 30 gender studies programs on the continent and beyond. These come from universities all over Africa and in the diaspora with representations from the USA, Canada, UK, Hungary, Czech Republic, Israel, India, Australia, and Latin America among others.

PROF, GRACE BANTEBYA APPOINTED HEAD OF GRANTS ADMINISTRATION AND MANAGEMENT UNIT



The Vice Chancellor Makerere University Prof. Barnabas Nawangwe appointed CHUSS Professor Grace Bantebya Kyomuhendo Head of Grants Administration and Management Unit of Makerere University. Bantebya Kyomuhendo is a Professor of Women and Gender Studies; and advocate for gender equality, social transformation and respect for women's rights.

She is a distinguished social anthropologist with a wealth of experience in gender/feminist and social norms research. Prof. Bantebya is the Principal Investigator (PI) on the "Whole University Approach: Kicking Sexual Harassment out of Higher Education Institutions in Uganda" (KISH Project).

In accordance with article 9.0 (b) (i) of the Makerere University Grants Administration Policy, the Vice Chancellor appointed Prof. Grace

Bantebya Kyomuhendo Head of Grants Administration and Management Unit for a period of five (5) years with immediate effect.

The Head of Grants Administration and Management Unit reports directly to the Deputy Vice Chancellor (Finance and Administration).

The responsibilities of the Head of Grants Administration and Management Unit include:

- Undertaking regular mapping and maintaining an up-to-date database of grants and funding opportunities and ensuring that these
- opportunities are communicated to faculty and staff in a timely manner
- Ensuring that Makerere University is registered with various funding agencies where necessary
- Supporting faculty and other staff of the University in the preparation of grants applications
- Supporting award winners in the grant negotiations and coordinate with relevant University authorities for the signing processes

- Liaising with relevant University authorities for project account set-up wherever necessary
- Following -up with Principal Investigators to ensure timely compliance with grant contract conditions and University policies
- Ensuring that concluded projects are appropriately closed out in accordance with University policies and guidelines
- Maintaining a database of all grants in the University
- Ensuring that all projects comply with the laws and policies of the University
- Be the Secretariat to the Grants Management Steering Committee
- Undertaking Monitoring, evaluation and quality assurance in the execution of grants at the University
- Preparing quarterly reports in accordance with the provisions of this policy

RESEARCH DISSEMINATION ON THE PLACE OF MEN AND BOYS IN GENDER EQUALITY



The School of Women and Gender Studies, under the Early Career Scholars research programme held a conversation on *Rethinking the place of men and masculinities in feminist activism in Uganda*. The study was sponsored under the Andrew W Melon Foundation.

The conversation was informed by the research conducted by Dr. Amon Ashaba Mwiine under the mentorship of Assoc. Prof Josephine Ahikire on the Feminist Activism and its encounter with notions of Men and Masculinities.

The blended event was held on Wednesday 15th December, 2021

in the CHUSS smart room and attended by the Principal and Deputy Principal CHUSS, the Dean School of Women and Gender Studies, Makerere staff, prominent Ugandan women activists and public servants among others.

Dr. Amon Ashaba Mwiine was investigating activism around women's rights and how that activism engages with the quest of men and masculinity.

The study found out that, men's behaviors and practices are not universal and that unlike the tendency to think that men

represent power and privilege and that they cannot be vulnerable and disadvantaged, in many cases, men have found themselves at a disadvantage either not knowing how to contribute to gender equality or occupying the positions of vulnerability.

NAI is also a member of several networks globally.

Ahikire is an Associate Professor of Gender Studies and the current Principal CHUSS. This selection was based on her 25-year track record of cutting-edge feminist research and gender training. Dr. Ahikire joins six other

Associate members from various institutions who have been selected as NAI Associates for the period September 2021 to August 2022. Under this program, Ahikire is tasked with, among others:

1. Contributing to the analytical capacity of NAI;
2. Promoting joint interest towards African studies and development of the Continent;
3. Promoting the institute's knowledge and experience base and its profile;

DR. JULIUS OMONA TO LEAD EAST AFRICAN REGION CLUSTER ON GETSPA RESEARCH PROJECT



21st May 2021: The Gender Equitable and Transformative Social Policy for Post-COVID-19 Africa (GETSPA) Project, which is based at the Institute of African Studies at the [University](#) of Ghana, and supported by the Open Society Foundations of Africa, commissioned multi-country teams across Africa, with the objective to transform - through research, advocacy, networking, documentation and constituency building activities- the approaches to and cultures of social policymaking and implementation in Africa. The research activities under GETSPA focus on understanding the framing and value propositions underpinning social policy; the assumptions about the role of the state, markets and society;

the interface between social and economic policies; and the socio-economic development outcomes of social policy, particularly in terms of gender, class and spatial inequalities.

GETSPA is an Africa-wide study project, consisting of 10 clusters and Dr. Julius Omona, an Associate Professor in the Department of Social Work and Social Administration at Makerere University will lead the East African Region Cluster comprising of Makerere University, Kenyatta University, University of Dar es Salaam and University of Rwanda.

A PRE-APPLICATION WORKSHOP FOR PROSPECTIVE 2022 GRADUATE APPLICANTS HELD



CHUSS on 19th March 2022, held a pre-application workshop for the prospective 2022 PhD applicants for Gerda Henkel Call. The blended workshop held physically and online attracted over 30 Ugandans with graduate education at a level of masters in the humanities and social sciences. Another over 30 non-Ugandan participants from Kenya, Tanzania, Nigeria and other countries attended online.

This initiative comes after the 2017 round of application, when it was

The purpose of this pre-writing workshop is to meet with the possible applicants and clarify, especially the issue of historical humanities and humanistic social sciences-an academic area that is not common within the African and Ugandan universities hence,

the need for applicants to be acquainted with the application process as an important moment in their lives that should be given all the attention it deserves..


