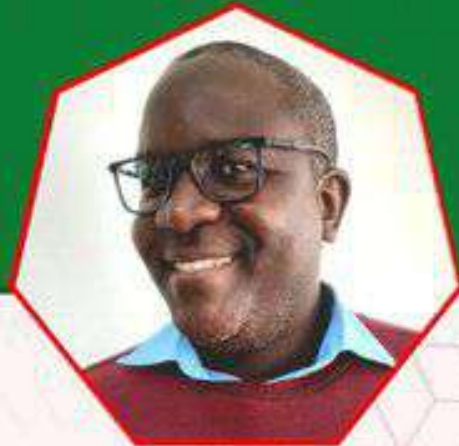
FROM DECOLONIZATION TO CRITICAL COSMOPOLITANISM: FEMINIST BORDER THINKING AS A DIALOGUE BETWEEN CENTRAL AND EASTERN EUROPE AND SUB-SAHARAN AFRICA

ABSTRACT

Recently, calls for decolonization have regained a strong presence in academic debates and beyond, highlighting decolonization as a necessary precondition for new critical imaginaries of a planetary cooperation. The presentation will explore border thinking as a method for a decolonial reconstruction of transnational feminist scholarship. In particular, it will focus on two geopolitical context, Central and Eastern Europe (CEE) and sub-Saharan Africa, which both symbolise non-Western difference, yet in a very different scale and form. The goal is to outline a feminist critique of the global political economy of knowledge production, embedded in lived experiences in these two geopolitical contexts in order to explore how these two lines of criticism can inform each other in an effort to outline a feminist vision of (pluriversal) critical cosmopolitanism.
