## Eligibility and requirements

The applicant should

- Applicants for the Ph.D. fellowships should be duly registered. Applicants for the Postdoctoral fellowships should hold a PhD with a proven research record in WaSo related areas. In addition, applicants should:
- Be members of staff of Makerere University
- Be willing to undertake and complete field research and write-up (including publishing in recognized journals) within the specified period;
- Postdoctoral applicants should be willing to participate in joint supervision.
- Females are highly encouraged to apply.
- Provide a full Curriculum Vitae (CV) with primary and alternative contacts, copies of academic documents, statement of research interest and contact addresses (phone and email) of two referees.
