Theme: Supporting Teaching, Learning and Research at Global South Higher Education

Institutions

Institutions of Higher Education located in the Global South have always been resource constrained, a fact

that has had a profound impact on the quality of teaching, learning and research. The panacea to the above

cited resource constraints that plague institutions in the Global South was believed to be the saturation of

education-related ICT hardware, software and infrastructure at the turn of the 21st century. This perhaps

explains why most Higher Education institutions had an ODEL policy and a barebone infrastructure that

was rolled out following COVID-19 related disruptions and closures. It was assumed that teaching, learning

and research in these institutions would sidestep resource constraints by transiting to online platforms of

learning, teaching and research. This assumption belies real concerns of internet inaccessibility, outrage,

socio-economic hardships and gendered biases that still persist in this sector. The challenges of resource-

stress call for continued conversations on how to facilitate teaching, learning and research. As part of these

conversations, CHUSS's Center of Excellence in Research, Teaching and Learning at Makerere University

is convening a two-day colloquium to probe how centers like CERTL can contribute to robustly effective

learning, teaching and research at resource-constrained Higher Education Institutions in the Global South.

The colloquium will grapple with the following themes:

1. Global South Recent Pedagogical Innovations amidst Resource Constraints;

2. Lessons and Innovations gleaned from Recent Pedagogical Interventions;

3. Harnessing Internet Hardware and Infrastructure for Effective Teaching, Learning and Research;

4. Navigating Faculty and Students Safely Practices, Policies and Directives of Online Pedagogy;

5. The Future of Teaching, Learning and Research in Resource Stressed Global South Institutions;

6. Internship and Experiential Learning as Panacea to Resource Constraints at Global South

Institutions

7. Gender, Class, Disability and other Forms of Exclusion in Resource-stressed Institutions and;

8. The New Student/Faculty/ Researcher in the 21st Century Institution of Higher Education in the

Global South.
