### **Academic Administration**

For purposes of academic administration, it is divided into six units, five of which are called schools headed by Deans, and one institute headed by a Director.

3. The School of Languages, Literature and Communication Dean Dr Aaron Mushengyezi
4. The School of Psychology – Dean Dr. Julius Kikooma
5. The School of Women and Gender Studies – Dean – Dr. Josephine Ahikire
6. Makerere Institute of Social Research – Director – Prof. Mahmoud Mamdani

It also has support administrative sections that provide services such as Human Resources, Communications office, Library services, College Academic Registry, and Finance. In addition, it has general services centres such the Centre for Languages services and the Centre for Psychological services.

### **Facts and figures**

The College has a total of 8500 students, 300 academic staff and 80 non-academic staff, and runs 28 graduate and 14 undergraduate programmes. The academic staff are supported by a part-time teachers in areas of critical need.
